13:15 MASTERCLASS – Innovative and powerful storytelling

By: Nigel Pope (Director Maramedia, UK) Duration: 1,5 hours (including Q&A)

The focus of this masterclass is to immerse the audience in Nigel Pope's innovative and powerful story-driven approach, which has earned him numerous international awards and nominations, including BAFTA, Wildscreen Panda, and Emmy.

Nigel has been working as a director for 30 years. Originally trained at Bristol's famous BBC Natural History Unit, he directed and produced many successful series, including Big Cat Week, Springwatch, and The Secret Life of Elephants. In 2010, together with his partner Jackie Savery, he founded Maramedia. The company specializes in global blue-chip programming and has produced a series of visually stunning and impactful films, such as Hebrides: Islands on the Edge, Stormborn, and Chasing the Rains.

The Rijnmaasmonding, shaped by natural processes, has a rich history and offers a glimpse into the future. In the documentary "The Forgotten Life of the Netherlands -Rijnmaasmonding" and its sequel "The Estuary of Tomorrow", experts explore how we can collaborate with nature to create a resilient landscape. Since 2020 Rik van der Linden decided to put all his work at the service of nature. Human kind always has a role in his stories, because they have a role in our ecosystems too. The Wonderers (2024) is his first documentary for the big screen and premiering at the Wildlife Film Festival Rotterdam this year.


Last Cry of the Canyon Roman Willy

The Last Cry of the Canyon follows an international team of scientists and naturalists led by Taxon Expeditions as they explore Montenegro's Komarnica Canyon, one of Europe's last unexplored ecosystems.

Through breathtaking visuals and intimate sit-down interviews with scientists and local conservationists of the NGO Spasimo Komarnicu, this film highlights the race against time to protect Komarnica's fragile ecosystem. The film serves as a call to action, urging global efforts to preserve this irreplaceable wilderness before it's too late.

11:30 LECTURE – Producing character-led, behavior-driven wildlife films

by Will & Lianne Steenkamp (Producer and Director, Into Nature Productions, Namibia)

Beyond the charismatic allure of iconic African wildlife, Will & Lianne strive to create a deeper understanding of habitats in their films, highlighting the urgent need for conservation. But how do you make a film that evokes empathy and action through an intimate portrait, leading to a commitment to protect our planet's last wild places? In this lecture, Will and Lianne will explain their approach through practical examples.

After more than a decade in the nature and environmental television industry, Will and Lianne Steenkamp took a leap in 2009, embarking on an adventurous journey across Africa. With international recognition for their films, including two Emmy nominations, Best of Festivals, and multiple awards, they continue to reach a wide audience. Their work has been broadcast worldwide on channels such as BBC, National Geographic, Smithsonian, ORF, Arte, WDR, NDR, RTL, and many more.

A film is an ideal tool to elevate a topic and do have an impact. What can you do that your film has the impact you aim for? Wolfgang will explain with a few examples what can be done and what has been achieved. He will talk about the new reality that films with a mission find it hard to get distribution and what can be done to overcome these obstacles in terms of finding to new ways to get your film to the audiences and the power of green story telling.

Wolfgang Knöpfler is an accomplished documentary filmmaker who's films have been Oscar short listed, Emmy nominated and won Sundance. The films he has worked on have changed the world for the better. He will talk about the power of film as a medium that can change public opinion and even laws and suggest ways to make your film and impact campaign a success.

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14:30 WORKSHOP - SIGMA; Hybrid in focus

For many years, we relied on manual focus lenses to capture wildlife footage, and while this approach is still widely used, today's technology offers a range of focus control options that enhance our ability to get the perfect shot.

As wildlife filmmakers, we often work in diverse and challenging environments, where we may need to quickly lock onto fast-moving subjects, like a leaping squirrel, or set a fixed focus when leaving a camera in the forest for days.

In this workshop, we'll cover the benefits of autofocus versus manual focus and explore SIGMA's autofocus options, giving you a chance to test them firsthand.

From a young age, Jeffrey developed a passion for nature and photography, often exploring the Veluwe with his camera. This interest grew into a love for ecology, leading him to study Forest and Nature Management at Wageningen

University. During his studies, he worked on the film 'WILD' and later received a mentorship at National Geographic, starting as a camera assistant on 'Silence of the Tides.'

Since then, nature filmmaking has captivated him, and he has been involved in projects like 'Our Nature' and 'The Wild North Sea'.





15:45 WORKSHOP - Audio technology and cinematic 360 sound design

Join the producers of Apple TV's latest landmark natural history series Earthsounds for behind-the-scenes insight into the making of the award-winning series.

With over 3000 hours of specially recorded audio, captured on all seven continents, the team used new microphone technology and field craft to capture the sounds of the planet like never before. From the bizarre courtship calls of the Atlantic walrus to the slurping sounds of American Cottonwood trees sucking up water from their roots – the shows are packed full of sonic surprises. Mixed in Dolby atmos, the series takes viewers on acoustic journeys around the world, from the Australian Forests to the Arctic Circle

SAM HODGSON, Series Producer

Sam is an award-winning Executive producer and script writer whose shows have been nominated for 5 BAFTAs and won multiple RTS Awards. A Zoology graduate with a passion for storytelling, he started his career as a radio journalist before moving into wildlife filmmaking, producing series for the BBC, National Geographic, Sky and Apple TV+. Whilst at the BBC Natural History Unit he produced the award-winning Bill Bailey's





Jungle Hero, telling the story of Alfred Wallace, the co-discoverer of evolution by natural selection. He has been a key part of the team at Offspring for ten years and has overseen multiple projects. Earthsounds is the second landmark series he has series produced for Apple TV+.

TOM PAYNE, Series Director

Tom is a BAFTA and RTS winning Series Director with nearly 20 years' experience delivering high quality factual content. In his time at Offspring, Tom has been integral in developing, pitching, and producing genre re-defining natural history - 'Earth at Night in Colour' and 'Earthsounds' (Apple TV+). Previously at the BBC he played a key role in creating a new live natural history brand ('Big Blue Live' and 'Wild Alaska Live'), negotiated access to some of Papua New Guinea's most isolated tribes (Seven Wonders of the Commonwealth) and trekked across vast deserts to deliver lifechanging medical aid (Big Red-Nosed Desert Trek). Tom is a key member of Offspring's team, helping to create ambitious, modern and compelling wildlife television.


ROUTE
